
## **Iowa's** Forgotten Middle

Middle-skill jobs, which require education beyond high school but not a four-year degree, make up the largest part of America's and Iowa's labor market. Key industries in Iowa are unable to find enough sufficiently trained workers to fill these jobs.

### Demand for Middle-Skill Jobs is Strong

Fifty-six percent of all jobs in 2015 were middle-skill.





# Demand for Middle-Skill Jobs Will Remain Strong

Between 2014-2024, 52 percent of job openings will be middle-skill.

#### Job Openings by Skill Level, Iowa, 2014-2024



### A Middle-Skill Gap

Middle-skill jobs account for 56 percent of Iowa's labor market, but only 50 percent of the state's workers are trained to the middle-skill level.
